

Section 3 Policies and Procedures for Recipients or HOME and/or HTF Program Funds

The West Virginia Housing Development Fund (the Fund) and the entities to which it provides HOME and HTF funds (collectively Federal funds) must comply with Section 3 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968, as amended (Section 3). Section 3 requires that economic opportunities that are generated by the use of Federal funds be made available to low- and very low-income persons, particularly those who receive Federal financial assistance for housing and those residing in communities where the financial assistance is expended. **Section 3 establishes benchmark goals for** (a) 25% of total labor hours worked by Section 3 workers, and (b) 5% of total labor hours worked by **Targeted Section 3 workers**.

These procedures summarize the Section 3 requirements and describe how the Fund implement them. They outline what the Fund and its housing partners must do to comply with Section 3 and identify the record-keeping and reporting requirements that funded entities must conduct.

The Section 3 implementing regulations (at 24 CFR part 75) can be found at <u>Exctromy code of</u> Federal Regulations (eCFR).

Section 3 applies to Section 3 projects as follows [24 CFR 75.3(a)(2,1)]:

Section 3 projects means housing rehabilitation, housing construction, and other public construction projects assisted under HUD programs that provide bousing and summunity development financial assistance when the total amount of assistance to the project exceeds a threshold of \$200,000. The threshold is \$100,000 where the assistance is from the Lead Hazard Control and Healthy Homes programs, as authorized by Sections 501 or 502 of the Housing and such above the total 1970 (12 U.S.C. 1701z-1 or 1701z-2), the Lead-Based Paint Poisoning Prevention set (42 U.S.C 4801 *et seq.*); and the Residential Lead-Based Paint Hazard Reduction Act of 195. (42 U.S.C. 4851 *et seq.*). The project is the site or sites together with any building(s) and improvements leader on the site(s) that are under common ownership, management, and financing.

Whether the project is fully or part in cassing dunder HOME or HTF, Section 3 applies to the entire project [24 CFR 75.3(a)(2)(iii)].

Section 3 requirements do not oply to material supply contracts [24 CFR 75.3(b)].

Section 3 Employment and Training

To correct with Section 3 regulations, the Recipient must, to the greatest extent feasible, ensure employment and training opportunities arising in connection with the Section 3 project are provided to Section workers within the metropolitan area (or nonmetropolitan county) in which the project is located [24 CFR 75.19(a)(1)].

Where feasible, priority for opportunities and training should be given to [24 CFR 75.19(a)(2)(i-ii)]:

- Section 3 workers residing within the service area or the neighborhood of the project, and
- Participants in YouthBuild programs.

Section 3 Contracting

To comply with Section 3 regulations, the Recipient must, to the greatest extent feasible, ensure contracts for work awarded in connection with Section 3 projects are provided to business concerns that provide economic opportunities to Section 3 workers residing within the metropolitan area (or nonmetropolitan county) in which the project is located [24 CFR 75.19(b)(1)].

Where feasible, priority for contracting opportunities should be given to [24 CFR 75.19(b)(2)(i-i

- Section 3 business concerns that provide economic opportunities to Section 3 works residing within the service area or the neighborhood of the project, and
- YouthBuild programs.

Section 3 Reporting requirements

To comply with Section 3 regulations, the Recipient must report [24 CER 75. 5(a)]:

- The total number of labor hours worked;
- The total number of labor hours worked by Section 3 workers; and
- The total number of labor hours worked by Targeted Section 5 workers.

The labor hours reported must include the total number of labor hours worked on a Section 3 project, including labor hours worked by any subrecipients, connectors and subcontractors [24 CFR 75.25(a)(3)].

In order to meet Section 3 reporting requirements. Recipionts may report labor hours by Section 3 workers and Targeted Section 3 workers from professional services without including labor hours from professional services in the total number of abor hours worked for the project [24 CFR 75.25(a)(4)].

Additional Reporting if Section 3 . ex. thma. ks are not met [24 CFR 75.25(b)]

If the Recipient's reporting a dice as the Section 3 benchmarks have not been met, the Recipient must report on the nature of activitie pursued in the absence of not meeting Section 3 benchmarks (see Form 3.28b).

Section 3 Continct Provisions

Recipients must include language applying Section 3 requirements in any subrecipient agreement or concract for a Section 3 project [24 CFR 75.27(a)] (see Form 3.28a).

Section 3 by mess concern means (24 CFR 75.5):

(1) A business concern meeting at least one of the following criteria, documented within the last sixmonth period:

(i) It is at least 51 percent owned and controlled by low- or very low-income persons;

(ii) Over 75 percent of the labor hours performed for the business over the prior three-month period are performed by Section 3 workers; or

(iii) It is a business at least 51 percent owned and controlled by current public housing residents or residents who currently live in Section 8-assisted housing.

(2) The status of a Section 3 business concern shall not be negatively affected by a prior arrest or conviction of its owner(s) or employees.

(3) Nothing in this part shall be construed to require the contracting or subcontracting of a Section 3 business concern. Section 3 business concerns are not exempt from meeting the specifications of the contract.

Section 3 worker means (24 CFR 75.5):

(1) Any worker who currently fits or when hired within the past five years (time period only goes back to the 24 CFR 75 effective date of 11-30-2020) fit at least one of the following categories, as documented:

(i) The worker's income for the previous or annualized calendar year is below to income limit established by HUD.

- (ii) The worker is employed by a Section 3 business concer
- (iii) The worker is a YouthBuild participant.

(2) The status of a Section 3 worker shall not be negatively affected a prior arrest or conviction.

(3) Nothing in this part shall be construed to require the employment of someone who meets this definition of a Section 3 worker. Section 3 workers an not exempt from meeting the qualifications of the position to be filled.

Targeted Section 3 worker means [24 CFP 5.2.2.]:

A Targeted Section 3 worker for howing and community development financial assistance means a Section 3 worker who is:

(1) A worker employed by a Section 3 business concern; or

(2) A worker who current of the when hired five years (time period only goes back to the 24 CFR 75 effective date of 11 0 2020) first least one of the following categories, as documented within the past five years:

(i) Living within the service area or the neighborhood of the project, as defined in § 75.5; or

(ii) A Young and participant.

PURPOSE, AUTHORITY AND RESPONSIBILITY

Section 3 is a provision of the Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Act of 1968 that moves local economic development and individual self-sufficiency.

Section 3 requires that, to the greatest extent possible, economic opportunities that are generated by the use of Federal funds be made available to low- and very low-income person particularly nose who receive Federal financial assistance for housing and those residing in communitie, where the financial hours worked by assistance is expended. The contractor agrees to include this section 3 clause in every subcontract subject to compliance with regulations in 24 CFR part 75, and agrees to take appropriate action, as provided in an applicable provision of the subcontract or in this section 3 clause, upon a finding that the subcontractor is in violation of the regulations in 24 CFR part 37. The contractor will not subcontract with any subcontractor where the contractor has notice or knowledge that the subcontractor has been found in violation of the regulations 24 CFR part 75.
- D. Noncompliance with HUL's regulations in 24 CFR part 75 may result in sanctions, termination of this contract for defects and dearment or suspension from future HUD assisted contracts.
